St. Michaels – Eva Owens Burke died on February 24, 2010. She was 89.

Born on July 12, 1920 in Tacoma Park, MD, she was the daughter of Oliver and Ruby Sue Thomas Owens. She graduated from Montgomery Blair High School in 1937. On October 10, 1943, she married Francis Vernon Burke. She worked as an Administrative Assistant to the Director of Parks in Montgomery County, and was known for establishing the annual “Lollypop Concerts” held in Cabin John Regional Park, providing a fun-filled day for special needs children. In 1970, the Burkes purchased property on the Eastern Shore. They moved to St. Michaels in 1975.

Mrs. Burke has been involved in many community activities. She has served as a Girl Scout leader and sang in her church choir for many years. She was also an active member of the MNCPPC Retirees Association.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by her daughter, Janet “Jan” Burke, and her Maltese, “Becky Sue”. She was predeceased by her son, Robert F. Burke.
