January 14, 1913 - December 16, 2013

Eva Angel Burton of Chestertown, MD, died on Monday, December 16, 2013. She was 100 years old.

Mrs. Burton was born on January 13, 1913, in New Philadelphia, OH. She was the daughter of Luther and Laura Kilchenman Angel. Mrs. Burton graduated from Sparrows Point High School and attended Essex Community College during her later life as a student in their Friendly Seniors Program. She was an active member of Camp Chapel United Methodist Church in Perry Hall, MD, where she donated her time and talents. She also served as historian at the church and was active with the United Methodist Women.

She married on August 3, 1935, to George Franklin Burton of Baltimore, MD, and raised her daughter in Dundalk. In her later years, she resided in Oak Crest Village before moving to Chestertown in June of 2009.

Mrs. Burton adored her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Her longevity can be attributed to working her daily crossword puzzles, knitting while watching her beloved Orioles, reading, traveling in her earlier years, and loving her family. She was predeceased by her husband in 1979.

In addition to her daughter, Carol Cordes, with whom she resided, she is survived by three grandchildren, Judith Spaulding, William Crowley and Susan

Crowley, and four great-grandchildren.

Services will be held on Saturday, December 28, 2013, at 2 p.m. at Camp Chapel United Methodist Church in Perry Hall, MD. Interment will be in Meadow Ridge Memorial Park in Elkridge, MD.
