Evelyn Faye Presbury of Centreville, MD went to be with the Lord on Tuesday, July 5, 2011. She was 68.

Born April 17, 1943 in Lewistown, PA, she was the daughter of Pearl Virginia Norris Goss and the late, Christopher Harry Goss. She attended school in Grandville, PA and later in Baltimore, MD. She married William Presbury of Harford County, MD. Mr. Presbury died in November 2001. She worked in Prince George's County Schools in the cafeteria and after many years there she began working at the Casablanca Café in Upper Marlboro where all the local fire company employees would stop by to get a cup of coffee and say "Hi" just to see her smiling face. Following the death of her husband she moved to Centreville, MD to be near her family.

Faye was an avid NASCAR fan and every Sunday would be ready and waiting to root on her favorite driver "Dale Jr.". She also thoroughly enjoyed watching her WWF wrestling and was a huge fan of "The Rock". She enjoyed visiting the Amish county in PA, playing bingo, visiting with her friends at Tilghman Terrace and spending most of her time with her mother and sister, Ginny. She loved all animals, especially her cat, Callie.

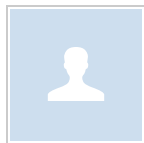

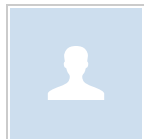
