



## Everett Manul Hooper

June 27, 1924 - January 7, 2009

Everett Manul Hooper of Denton, MD died on Wednesday, January 07, 2009 at Caroline Nursing Home. He was 84 years old.

Born on June 27, 1924 in Muskogee, OK to the late James Albert Hooper and Ethel Moran, Everett joined the service in his late teens and served for 22 1/2 years. He retired from the U.S. Air Force in 1965. He met his wife, Irene Crosby, in England and they were married on October 30, 1951. He traveled throughout his career to Europe.
