Faye Marie Cosden Lister died on Tuesday, December 8, 2009 at Easton Memorial Hospital. She was 74 years old.

Mrs. Lister was born to the late, Robert Cosden and Mildred Patchett on November 19, 1935 in Baltimore, MD. She graduated in the last class of Cordova High School in 1953 and married Charles S. Lister on July 3, 1953. She worked as a waitress and bartender and graduated from Chesapeake College in 1982. Mrs. Lister worked at Chesapeake College for 25 years retiring in 1999 as Director of Community and Professional Development. An Eastern Shore native, she took great pride in her family and community.

She was a current member and served as a past president of the Board of Education of Queen Anne's County. She was active in the Democratic Party at both the local and state levels serving on the Election Board and the Democratic Central Committee. Mrs. Lister was inducted to the American Softball Assoc. Hall of Fame, a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, a Character Counts Coach and an active board member of Day Care, Inc. in Centreville.

Mrs. Lister is survived by her husband of 56 years, Charles S. Lister of Centreville, MD; a daughter, Lisa Adkins and her husband, Kenneth, of Centreville, MD; two sisters, Teresa "Polly" Cosden and Peggy Jordan; and

four grandchildren, Jennifer N. Novak, Stephanie M. Novak, Donald H. Novak III, and J. Daniel Novak. She was predeceased by a son, John Charles Lister and two brothers, Bernard Cosden and Robert Cosden.

A memorial service will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Centreville, MD at 11:00am on Saturday, May 8, 2010.
