



Fayez B. Hanna

September 10, 1936 - July 12, 2011

Dr. Fayez Batra Hanna of Stevensville, formerly of North Potomac, MD, died on July 12, 2011.

Born on September 10, 1936 in Quena, Egypt, he was the son of the late Batra Hanna and Tafida Abadier Hanna. Dr. Hanna was renowned for discovering how to get arsenic out of drinking water. He worked as a professor at Missouri Central State University. He later moved to Hartford, CT and then Rockville, MD, where he went to work for the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). He retired from OSHA as a Director.

Dr. Hanna is survived by his son, Peter F. Hanna of Stevensville; his grandchildren, Chase Hanna, Cody Hanna and Leah Hanna; and his brothers and sisters. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife, the former Hyat Ibrahim Ghabour, whom he married on January 25, 1970.
