



F. Charles "Charlie" Campbell

April 11, 1951 - July 25, 2009

Frederick Charles "Charlie" Campbell of Church Hill died Saturday, July 25, 2009, at Hospice of Queen Anne's Hospice House in Centreville. He was 58.

Charlie was born April 11, 1951 in Philadelphia, PA. His family moved to Easton in 1955 and to Rolphs Wharf in northern Queen Anne's County in 1968.

He was a 1970 graduate of Queen Anne's County High School. While still living in Queen Anne's, Charlie worked for the Record Observer in Centreville as a photographer and for Drug Fair in Chestertown.

He then moved to Vermont, where he managed a convenience store for about 10 years and worked in the bookstore at the University of Vermont. An advertisement in the Kent County News seeking a photographer brought him back home in 2000.

Charlie was diagnosed with cancer in June 2008 and used his illness to benefit the American Cancer Society, Relay for Life and Locks of Love. Through surgeries and treatments, he continued to work at the Kent County News up until his most recent hospitalization earlier this month. He was transferred to the Hospice House on Thursday, July 23.

Charlie is survived by his mother, Peg Campbell of Church Hill; his father, Dave Campbell of Church Hill; sisters, Kathy Campbell Bennett and Tina Campbell Cohey, both of Chestertown; brothers, Fang Campbell and Scott Campbell, both of Church Hill and brother-in-law, Steve Cohey of Chestertown.

A Memorial Service will be held at noon on Tuesday, August 4, 2009 at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Church Hill, MD where friends may call one hour prior to the service.

The Rev. Nanese Hawthorn will officiate.
