Frances Ann Harris Brandt, age 88, of Chestertown, MD, died on Sunday, March 28 at Heron Point in Chestertown. She was the daughter of the late Roger (Sr.) and Ann Jones Harris.

Frances (Babe) Harris was born in Kent County, Maryland in 1922. She was a graduate of Chestertown High School (1939) and of Washington College (1943). She lived in Salisbury for many years before the death of her first husband. She taught algebra and trigonometry at Wicomico High School. After retirement, she returned to Chestertown and married Walter Brandt. She was a member of Christ United Methodist Church and a member of the Chester River Yacht and Country Club.

Her husband of 27 years, Walter C. Brandt, survives. She is survived by four of her children: Diane Dudderar Hamilton (Herb) of Chestertown, Raymond A. Dudderar (Linda) of California, MD, Catherine C. Duda (John) of Charlotte, NC, and Jody Dudderar (Bernardo) Valdes, of New York, NY; a stepsister, Sue Harris of Easton; two grandchildren, Heidi Dudderar and Kyle Dudderar; and three step-grandchildren, Jud Brandt, John Duda III and Matthew Duda; and a stepson, Stephen C. Brandt, of Pensacola, FL. A son, Greg Dudderar, and a grandson, Matthew DeMaggio, predecease her. Her first husband, Raymond Albert Dudderar died in 1976.

A funeral service will be held at 11 a.m. on Thursday, April 1, at Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home in Chestertown, MD, where friends may call an hour prior to the service. A visitation will be held on Wednesday evening from 6-8 pm. Interment will be in Chester Cemetery. Pastor Jane Ayres of Heron Point will officiate.
