



Francis U. Golt

July 4, 1917 - July 10, 2008

Francis U. "Bunny" Golt of Easton, MD; died on Thursday, July 10, 2008 at Corsica Hills Nursing Center, Centreville, MD. He was 91.

Born July 4, 1917 in Queenstown, MD, he was the son of the late Urban Thomas and Mary Favinger Golt. He served his country in the war effort by working in the shipyards in Baltimore during World War II, while his brothers, served our country. He later worked as a farmer, an owner/operator of a grocery store and drove a school bus for 19 years for Queen Anne's County. In his later life, he worked in maintenance for Upper Shore Aging in Centreville, MD; and then for fifteen years, he worked as maintenance man at Tilghman Terrace Apartments until moving to Easton in 1996. His wife the former Thelma L. Callahan, whom he married on February 18, 1941, died December 28, 2007.

He was a member of Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church in Centreville until moving to Easton where he was a member of Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church.

Mr. Golt is survived by two children, Francis L. Golt and his wife Pat of Middletown, DE; Nancy L. Holleny and her husband Rich of Denton, MD; five grandchildren, Stephen Golt of Wilmington, DE; Karen Young of Newark, DE; Brett Rhodes of Easton, MD; Robyn Wilson of Roanoke, VA; and Kelle May of

Sterling, VA; nine great-grandchildren; and a special niece/nurse, Lynda. In addition to his parents, and his wife Mr. Golt was predeceased by three brothers; Leon, Joe and Marian Golt; and three sisters, Catherine Golt, Agnes Shortall, and Viola Carll.

A funeral liturgy will be celebrated, on Tuesday, July 15, 2008 at 11:00 AM at Mother of Sorrows Catholic Church, Centreville, MD. Friends may call on Tuesday morning from 9:30 to 10:30 AM at Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., Centreville, MD.

“ I will always remember Bunny's great sense of humour and how he made me feel like a member of the family long before he even really knew me. His calm, easygoing manner could not mask his determination and desire to do things right. I loved to banter back and forth with him because he could give as well as he could take. He was pretty competitive and loved to play cards, shuffleboard, bingo etc. One time as I was lining up a potentially game winning shot in a backyard game of croquet, I heard Bunny say just as I was hitting the ball "You can't make that shot" and I shanked the shot and missed. Here was my 88 year old father-in-law talking trash to me in a "friendly" game. He didn't like to lose. Bunny loved his coffee and he loved it black. The first time he saw me fix my coffee with cream and sugar, he kind of narrowed his eyes and said " that's not even coffee anymore". Thelma used to get hair done every Thursday and Bunny didn't go with her. I had to drop something off at their house and it was around three in the afternoon and I guess Thelma's hair appointment was at two P.M. I knocked on the door and Bunny answered with one of those 7 oz. Corona beers in his hand. He smiled and asked me if I wanted one and I declined because I had work to do. I wondered if he had a cold beer or two every time Thelma had her hair done and thought to myself that I hope I'm living my life that fully when I'm his age. And when it comes right down to it, that's the thing. Bunny lived his life fully and filled it doing the things that he loved (and that included work) and spending his time with family and friends that he loved.
