Frank Allan Blatt of Queenstown, MD died on August 14, 2017 at Compass Regional Hospice. He was 74.

Born in Washington, DC on April 12, 1943, he was the son of the late Max and Elly Gross Blatt. Frank grew up in the Washington, DC area, and then had the opportunity to attend high school in Switzerland, returning, to spend just a few months at the Merritt School, from which he graduated. He then attended college before beginning to work in the construction industry. He became a general contractor and opened Northwood Contractors, based in Annapolis, MD, which contributed to the construction of countless schools in Maryland and Virginia. More recently, Frank worked for Advance CAD Services, spending his time capturing old blueprints for use in AutoCAD technology.

Frank was a competitive offshore boat racer, and a member of the Chesapeake Bay Powerboat Association. He became a champion on a boat he built himself, Priority. Frank spent time in pursuit of sailfish and tarpon, and traveling the world, especially Europe. He also made time every year to travel to Aspen to ski.

He is survived by his loving wife, Carol Blatt; his children: Tyler Blatt, Dana Burton (Kenny), Billy Machen (Tracy), Mark Machen, Cindy Evans (Keith) and Helen Cochran (Keith); 14 grandchildren; and 10 great-grandchildren.
