



Frank T. Hogg Jr.

August 30, 1924 - May 19, 2015

Frank Trevor Hogg, Jr., died in Easton, MD, May 19, 2015, at 2:20 a.m. at the age 90. He was born August 30, 1924, to Frank T. Hogg Sr., and Mary Crocker Devereux Hogg.

A life well-lived and full of adventure, the high point of his life was his doubling Cape Horn under sail on the 72-foot yawl Stormvogle from San Diego to Long Island Sound. How did he get there?

He was born in Cambridge, MA, and brought up from the age of four in Milton, MA. He graduated from Tabor Academy, Marion, MA, in 1942. He entered the US Army in April of 1943, and served throughout WWII, including stints in Southeastern France and the Philippines. Discharged in 1946, he arrived in Centreville, MD, to his family's new residence at the Wharf House. He graduated from Washington College in 1950, where he played football. After 15 years in the gas conversion business, he joined the engineering firm of J. Ray McCrone in their Centreville office. Following his McCrone service, he was engaged in the yachting world for the remainder of his working life.

Along the way, he was a captain for several different yacht owners, participated in several Bermuda races, several Trans-Atlantic races, as well as being a member of the 12-meter yacht team for the 1967 America's Cup defense.

Since 1987, he and his partner, Cecily Morrow, lived in Easton, MD. Sadly, Cecily passed away on May 4, 2015.

His life was embodied in the opening of John Masefield's poem "Sea Fever" --
I must go down to the seas again, to the lonely sea and sky/
and all I ask is a
tall ship and a star to steer her by.

He is survived by his brother, Alexander McClurg Hogg and his wife, Beatrice, of El Granada, CA; his two nieces and nephew; and seven grand-nieces and nephews.
