



Franklin Hawkins

August 3, 1917 - February 19, 2012

Franklin Hawkins, 94, formerly of Arlington, VA, and a long-time resident of William Hill Manor in Easton, MD, died on Sunday, February 19, 2012. He was born in Montclair, NJ, on August 3, 1917. He was the son of Wilford Judson and Julia Davenport Fackler Hawkins, and husband of the late Helen Boswell Hawkins. He and his wife had a daughter, Anne, who died in infancy.

During part of his childhood he lived for several years with his parents and four older sisters at Rich Neck Manor in Claiborne, MD. He attended middle school in Easton before attending St. Andrew's School in Middletown, DE. He later earned his BS from MIT. During World War II he joined the US Navy and served in Pearl Harbor during the attack in 1941. He was later transferred to the David Taylor Model Basin in Washington, DC, where he was a specialist in naval architecture. After the War and until his retirement he worked for the CIA in Langley, VA, as an analyst with expertise in Soviet submarine design. Upon retiring to Easton, MD, he became a loyal volunteer for Choptank Habitat for Humanity and a parishioner of Trinity Cathedral, Easton.

He is survived by sixteen nephews and nieces, John Hawkins Miller of Easton, MD; David F. Miller of Easton, MD; Lucy K. Stevens of York, PA; Julia D. Stevens of Harpswell, ME; Clement S.
