



Frederick John Holste, Jr.

August 11, 1924 - May 15, 2017

Frederick John “Fred” Holste, Jr., of Coatsville, PA, formerly of Betterton, MD, died on May 15, 2017, at Tel Hai Nursing Facility in Honey Brook, PA. He was 92.

He was born in Canton, MD, on August 11, 1924, the son of the late Frederick John Sr. and Betty Wiedenhoeft Holste. He was a graduate of Patterson High School. He served his country in the U.S. Navy and was honorably discharged.

Mr. Holste married the late Dolores Geraldine Waldt and made their home in Parkville, MD.

Mr. Holste worked as a Baltimore County Police officer retiring in 1981. He and his wife moved to Betterton where he enjoyed fishing and caring for his lawn. He was known to the community in Betterton as “Mr. Tractor Man.” He was a member of Chester Lodge #115 AF & AM.

He is survived by his children, Larry F. Holste of Fallston, MD, Fred J. Holste III of Frederick, MD, Doug F. Holste of Coatesville, PA; and six grandchildren, David Holste, Laura Gross, Jessica Holste, Crystal Hawkins, Leslie Holste, and Jennifer Holste; along with twelve great-grandchildren.

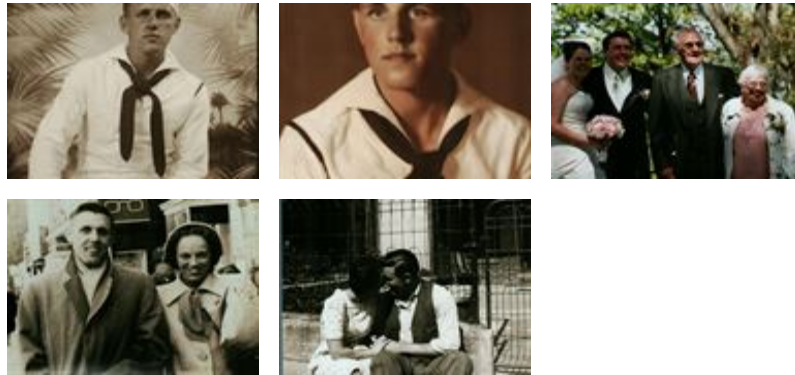
