A Funeral Liturgy for Frederick Martin Smith of Easton, MD will be celebrated at Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church, Easton on Tuesday, September 28, 2004 at 12:00 Noon. Mr. Smith died on Thursday, September 23, 2004 at Memorial Hospital at Easton. He was 73.

Born in Braddock, PA June 18, 1931, he was the son of the late Clyde Martin, Sr. and Elizabeth Christman Smith. After graduating from Swissvale High School, Swissvale, PA in 1949, he joined the U.S. Maritime Service where he trained as a chef and baker. He then worked on ships on the Great Lakes until 1951 when he joined the U.S. Navy. Following his release from active duty in 1955, he made his home in Baltimore until moving to Easton in 1964. He was employed by Eskay Poultry Co., BP Oil Co., and the Tidewater Inn as Banquet Chef. In 1972 he was employed by the Memorial Hospital, Easton as a cook, later worked as a refrigeration mechanic and finally as a patient services representative until his retirement in 1995. For the last five years, Fred has been an avid writer for the Star Democrat Editorial page.

A member of Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church, Easton, he was also a member of B.P.O. Easton Elks Lodge #1622.

Mr. Smith is survived by his wife, the former Rosemarie Heilman, whom he married in Baltimore in February 1953; a daughter, Rosanne Elizabeth Towers

and her husband Keith of Easton; a son, Frederick M. Smith, Jr. U.S.A.F. and his wife Heidi of Dover; four grandchildren, Megan and Kyle Smith and Martina and Melissa Towers; and a brother, Clyde M. Smith Jr. of Easton
