



Garnet Lucille Kikta

January 16, 1928 - January 8, 2016

Garnet Lucille Kikta of Stevensville, MD, passed away on January 8, 2016, at Anne Arundel Medical Center. She was 87.

Garnet was born in Melcroft, PA, the daughter of the late Marsh and Grace Knopsnyder on January 16, 1928. She graduated from Connellsville High School in Connellsville, PA. Garnet and her girlfriends moved to Washington, DC, to find employment. She worked at the White House for President Truman. Garnet met her husband, who was also from PA, on the train going home on the weekends. It was love at first sight.

Vincent Kikta died July 26, 2014. They would have been married 69 years. They had resided in Berlin, MD, since 1991.

Garnet is survived by her son, Captain Mark D. Kikta, USN (Retired) and his wife Kathy of Lothian, MD; daughter Michelle S. Kikta of Stevensville, MD; two grandchildren, Brandon D. Kikta; Sean Hall of Jacksonville, FL; and two great-grandchildren. She was predeceased by her husband, Vincent Kikta; her parents; sister, Helen Bundorf; and brother, Kenneth Knopsnyder.
