Gayland Newton Clark of Sudlersville, MD died Sunday, April 13, 2008 at his home in Sudlersville. He was 77.

Gayland N. Clark was born January 25, 1931 in Queen Anne's county the son of the late Vernon Clark and Nettie "Baker" Clark. Mr. Clark was a 1949 graduate of Sudlersville High School. He worked as a lab technician for General Foods and retired in 1988. Mr. Clark was a member and past president of Sudlersville Lion's Club and a member of the Amateur Softball Association Hall of Fame where he was inducted in April of 1998. He was a past Sudlersville Town Commissioner, a youth baseball coach and former referee and umpire and was the recipient of the Benedict A. Andrew Sons of American Legion Squadron #296 Award for Outstanding Contributions to Sports in Queen Anne's County. He loved playing baseball, basketball and soccer in high school as well as after high school in various leagues in the area. He also enjoyed hunting, fishing, golf and playing cards.

In addition to his parents Mr. Clark was preceded in death by his wife of 54 years, Frances Clough Clark and two brothers, Marion Clark and Beverly Clark.

He is survived by two sons, Greg Clark and wife Trudy of Sudlersville, MD, Randy Clark and wife Laurie of Sudlersville, MD, and two grand daughters, Rebecca Clark Lepter of Kennedyville, MD, and Jordan Clark of Sudlersville, MD.
