



## George Casimere Lemay

January 5, 1919 - February 22, 2012

George C. Lemay of Queenstown, MD, died on February 22, 2012, surrounded by his loving family. He was 93.

Born in Quebec, Canada, on January 5, 1919, he was the son of the late Feu Joseph and Loretta Varetti Lemay. George was raised in Dundalk, MD, and served in the Navy in World War II, where he learned how to weld, both above and below water. When he returned to Dundalk, he worked at Sparrows Point as a welder until the early 1950s. At that time, George moved to Queenstown, where he soon established Lemay's Welding, which he operated until his retirement in 1995. He also taught welding at Chesapeake College. Of all the interesting structures on which he worked, George was most proud of his contribution to the construction of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge.

He enjoyed spending time at home, traveling in his motor home, and watching his grandchildren play sports.

He is survived by his wife, Betty Virginia Lemay; his daughters, Stacy Smith and her husband Jeff, of Easton, and Tammy Ebling of Ridgely; his grandchildren, Kim Hoxter and her husband, Keith, John Duty III, Eli Smith, Jacob Smith, Steven Ebling and Kayla Ebling; his great-grandchildren, Nicholas Hoxter and Nathan Hoxter; and his brother, Jimmy Hans of Dundalk. He was predeceased by his first wife, Margaret June Lemay, who died in

1991.
