



George Zinnemann

February 9, 1920 - March 29, 2010

George Zinnemann, Colonel, USAF (Ret.), 90, a resident of Ginger Cove in Annapolis, Maryland, passed away on Monday, March 29, 2010 at Anne Arundel Medical Center in Annapolis, MD. Mr. Zinnemann was born on February 9, 1920 in Vienna, Austria and was the son of the late Oskar Zinnemann and Anna (Feiwei) Zinnemann.

Mr. Zinnemann was a native of Vienna, Austria and traveled to the United States in 1938. He joined the United States Army six weeks before Pearl Harbor and was commissioned in the Medical Administrative Corps. in 1942. George served three years in the European Theater of Operations during World War II. After the war, he served for three years as Assistant Administrator of the Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York City. He then reentered the service, transferring to the Air Force Medical Service Corps. His assignments included service as Executive Officer of the NATO Advisory Group for Aerospace R&D and as Administrator of Malcolm Grow Medical Center at Andrews Air Force Base, Maryland. His military decorations include the Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal and the Joint Services Commendation Medal. George was fluent in three languages and worked as a freelance translator after retiring in 1975. He was a member of the American Medical Writers Association and a Fellow of the Aerospace Medical Association.

Among George's hobbies were photography and creative writing.

George is survived by his two daughters, Judy Ann Zinnemann of Paris, France and Teresa Jane Antonioli and son-in-law, Vincent Antonioli of Aquasco, Maryland; two grandchildren, Kathryn Nicole Antonioli and Michael "Tony" Antonioli. He was preceded in death by his wife, Elizabeth "Lee" A. Zinnemann in 2004 after 60 years of marriage.

A concert to celebrate George's life will be held at Ginger Cove Friendship Hall, 4000 River Crescent Drive, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 in the summer of 2010.
