George August Taylor of Centreville, MD, formerly of Rosedale, MD died at the Woodlands Assisted Living on Sunday, November 27, 2005. He was 88.

Born April 28, 1917 in Baltimore County, MD, he was the son of the late George Holmes and Elizabeth Rose Brietenbach Taylor. He graduated from Kenwood High School in the Class of 1935. He entered the plumbing industry serving his apprenticeship at Bethlehem Steel and later with the George R. Hardesty Plumbing Co. In 1945 he was drafted into the U.S. Army. In 1949 he began his own plumbing business, George A. Taylor Plumber. In 1960 he changed the course of his career and became a plumbing inspector for Baltimore County. When he retired in 1980 he was a supervisor of plumbing inspectors. He then moved to Centreville, MD. On February 13, 1964 he married the former Doris Anthony of Centreville, MD. Mrs. Taylor died in 2001.

He was a member of Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Baltimore, MD; a member of Rosedale Post #180 where he was a Past Commander in 1947, a member of the Centreville Lodge #180 A.F. & A.M. and he was a past President of the Twin Distric Democratic Club of Rosedale, MD.

Mr. Taylor is survived by two sons, Ernest Allen Taylor of Rosedale, MD and George Stephen Taylor of Madrid, Spain; a step-son, George Yewell of Centreville, MD; two sisters, Rose Karmazon of Baltimore and Dorothea Rackl

of Rosedale, MD; three grandsons, George Paul Taylor of Madrid, Spain, Carlos Taylor of Timonium, MD and Ernest Allen Taylor, Jr. of Bel-Air, MD and nine great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday, December 1, 2005 at the Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P. A., Centreville, MD at 2:00 PM. Friends and family may call at the funeral home on Wednesday evening from 6 – 8 PM.

Burial will be at Chesterfield Cemetery, Centreville, MD.
