



George H. Eichnor, Jr.

February 17, 1922 - August 5, 2009

George Hobart Eichnor, Jr. died on Wednesday, August 5, 2009 at The Pines in Easton. He was 87.

Mr. Eichnor was born on February 17, 1922 in Salisbury, MD. He was born in his grandfathers home on 213 East Division St., which still stands today. His parents were the late George Eichnor, Sr. and Elsie Tomlinson Eichnor. He attended Wicomico High School in Salisbury where he was the quarterback on the football team for 3 years.

Mr. Eichnor attended Randolph Macon Naval Academy in Fort Royal, VA. He entered the U.S. Navy in 1942 and served as an Aerographers Mate Third Class on the USS Dakota. He was awarded the European Theatre Ribbon, Pacific Theatre Ribbon with One Star, American Theatre Ribbon and the Victory Medal before his honorable discharge in 1946. He attended the University of Notre Dame, Berrea College and received a Bachelor's degree from the University of Maryland in 1958.

He married the late Elizabeth Eichnor in 1953. They moved to Easton in 1967 and resided at 210 Brookletts Ave. in Easton for 36 years. Mr. Eichnor was a coach and teacher at Easton High School and Col. Richardson High School for many years. Many will remember Mr. "E" or " teach " as someone who brought fun and laughter into the classroom and loved every boy he coached.

Coaching was his passion.

Mr. Eichnor is survived by his daughters, Georgianna “Gigi” Smith of Manchester, MI and Kathy Morsell of New Mexico; a brother, John Eichnor, of Hawaii, and a grandson, Daniel Lowery, of San Diego.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 51 years, Elizabeth Eichnor, who passed away in 2005.
