George Jay Marsh, Jr., of Easton formerly of Sarasota, FL died at The Memorial Hospital at Easton on Saturday, January 17, 2004. He was 80.

Born in Spokane, WA, March 24, 1923, he was the son of the late George J., Sr. and Loretta Grono Marsh. After graduating from public school, he attended the Washington State University until serving in the U. S. Army in the Pacific Theatre of Operations during World War II. Following his release from active duty, he returned to Washington State University where he received his degree. He then worked for the Hollister-Steir Laboratories in Spokane and Chicago, IL. While living in the Chicago area, he was a member and Commander of the Arlington Heights, IL American Legion Post. He continued to work in the pharmaceutical industry until 1969 when he joined the Environmental Protection Agency in the Pesticide Regulation Division. After retiring from the Agency in 1987, he moved to Sarasota, FL where he lived until moving to Talbot County in 2001.

His wife, the former Arlyne F. Collier whom he married in March of 1951, died in March of 1999.

Mr. Marsh is survived by two daughters, Janet J. Matthews of Cheverly, MD and Judith A. Marsh of Easton with whom he had made his home for the last year and two grandchildren, Ian Matthews and Eric Matthews. A son, George

J. Marsh III, died in 1986 and a sister, Marilyn J. Hepburn, died in 2000.
