



Gladys Elizabeth Smith Truitt

December 28, 1914 - December 3, 2011

Gladys Truitt of Bel Air MD, formerly of Sudlersville, MD, died Saturday December 3, 2011, in the Hospice Unit of Stella Maris Center, Timonium, MD. She was 96.

Mrs. Truitt was born December 28, 1914. She was one of two daughters of the late Lee F. and Mary Legar Smith. She was a native of Sudlersville MD, living nearly all her life on nearby farms and in town. In early 2010, she moved to Bel Air, MD, to be near her son. Mrs. Truitt was a graduate of Sudlersville High School in 1931 and recently attended her 80th class reunion. In May of 1932, she married Samuel Clayton Truitt, also of Sudlersville, and a high school classmate. Samuel died in 1982.

Mrs. Truitt is survived by a daughter, Nancy T. Coggins of Greenville, SC, and her son, David Dean Truitt of Havre de Grace, MD; three grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, all descendants of Nancy. During her life, she was a farm child and wife, a private seamstress, a Sudlersville librarian, and a member of the Calvary-Asbury United Methodist Church in Sudlersville, MD. She was also active in community affairs

Graveside services will be held on Saturday, December 17, 2011, at 1pm in the Sudlersville Cemetery, Sudlersville, MD.
