Glenn Marshall Foster, Sr. of Centreville, MD died at the Hospice House, Centreville, MD on Friday, May 16, 2008 following a 13 year battle with lung cancer.

Born May 12, 1941 in Glennwood Park, PA, he was the son of the late William D. Foster, Jr. and Dorothy Collison Foster. He grew up in Starr, MD and graduated from Centreville High School. He married Janice Towers on May 20, 1962 and she died May 2000. He was a master carpenter working with Gannon & Sons for 40 years until he became self employed as Glenn Foster & Sons, retiring in 2004.

He enjoyed playing pool, spending time with his family and he was a social member of the American Legion Jeff Davis Post.

Mr. Foster is survived by his wife, Betty June Foster whom he married December 8 2003; three sons, Glenn M. Foster, Jr. of Easton, Vince Foster and Troy Foster, both of Preston, MD; a sister, Wanda Foster Deese of Monroe, NC; 13 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren and many nieces and nephews. In addition to his first wife, he was pre-deceased by a brother, William "Bill" D. Foster, III.
