



Grace Bainbridge Holt

April 18, 1917 - August 12, 2014

Grace Bainbridge Holt, resident of Easton, MD, died at home on August 12, 2014.

Born in Erie, PA in 1917, Grace married Harry Brown Bainbridge, Jr., in 1937. Making their home in Knoxville, TN, the Bainbridge's had three children. In 1948, the family moved to Oak Ridge, TN, and were active in St. Stephen's Episcopal Church and the town's civic life. Grace was a longtime member of the League of Women Voters, serving a term as the president of the State of Tennessee LWV. She became the first woman Senior Warden of St. Stephen's Vestry and was a founder and board member of the Oak Ridge Civic Music Association. She served on the boards of Oak Ridge Hospital and St. Andrews School of Sewanee, TN. After Harry's sudden death in 1955, Grace found employment at the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies and rose to the position of Fellowship Administrator.

Grace married Jack Nelson Holt in 1961, melding the two families of three children each, and together welcoming new family members through marriage and the birth of their grandchildren. Grace moved to Easton in 1992 when Jack entered William Hill Manor where he died in 1993. Grace was a member of Christ Church, Easton.

Grace was predeceased by her son, the Right Reverend Harry Bainbridge

and will be missed by her children, Lysbeth Bainbridge (Steven Ramberg) of Harpers Ferry, WV, Sarah Akridge (John) of Oxford, Robert Holt (Linda) of Clayton, GA, Philip Holt (Dabney) of Jackson, MS, Suzanne Lindholm (Robert) of Midlothian, VA; daughter-in-law Katherine Bainbridge (Easton); and Grace's 13 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

A Memorial and Holy Eucharist celebration will be held in Easton at 11 a.m. on Friday, September 5, 2014, at Trinity Cathedral.
