He was proud to be voted best musician at Cardinal O'Hara High School Class of 1979, then went on to study guitar and audio engineering at Berklee College of Music, graduating in 1983.

He worked to build his successful business, TVN - The Video Network, for 35 years. Gregg was passionate about his work and made a huge impact on the

AV and video production community in and around the Boston area. He spent many years working on projects like Golfing the World, TedX, Cookin' with Cutty, and many more.

In addition to his love for his work, he also enjoyed playing hockey, roller blading, playing guitar, boating, golfing, and breaking bread with friends and family.

He is survived by his wife, Natalie (Grivois) McAllister; two children, Gerard and Justine McAllister; his siblings, Anthony J. (Vicki) McAllister III, Michael Anne McAllister, and Reid F. (Nancy) McAllister; three nephews Anthony, Ian and Rory; and his niece (Brooklyn), who all love him dearly. He is predeceased by his loving parents, Anthony J. McAllister, Jr., and Muriel A. (Smith) McAllister.
