



## Greg J. Romain

A Funeral Liturgy for Greg L. Romain of Oxford, MD will be celebrated on Friday, September 18, 2004 at St. Michaels Chapel, St. Michaels, MD at 12:00 noon. Mr. Romain died at his home in Oxford, MD on Monday, September 13, 2004. He was 58.

Born April 4, 1946 in Caro, Michigan, he was the son of the late Benedict and Mildred Stewart Romain. He was a 1964 graduate of Twentynine Palms High School, Twentynine Palms, CA. In 1968 he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Whittier College, Whittier, CA, a Political Science major and History minor. He received his Teaching Certificate from Cal State-Fullerton in 1969.

After graduating from college he taught 8th grade in Prince George's County, Maryland from 1969– 1971. Then he joined the staff of The Star Democrat in Easton. He rose from editor of The Star Democrat to General Manager of The Star Democrat and its affiliated weekly newspapers on the Mid-Shore, served for a time as General Manager of The Cecil Whig in Elkton, another Chesapeake Publishing Corporation newspaper and then returned to general managership of The Star Democrat. During his tenure at The Star Democrat, the newspaper, one of the nation's oldest, was successfully converted from weekly to daily publication in August 1974. Mr. Romain was responsible for hiring and training a number of journalists who now enjoy successful careers

in newspapers up and down the East Coast.

After a highly successful career as Editor and General Manager of the Easton Star Democrat, Greg joined Legg Mason as a Financial Advisor in 1983. As a result of his professional approach and genuine care for his clients, he achieved President's Council for six years. In 1997, Greg was appointed Branch Manager of the Easton office. During his tenure, he distinguished himself by devising a detailed and disciplined method of reaching out and reassuring his clients. Today, Legg Mason Financial Advisors throughout the firm are using the Romain Contact System as an important tool in strengthening their relationships with their clients. At the time of his death he was First Vice President of Investments as well as Branch Manager of the Easton Office.

He was a former member of the Talbot County YMCA Youth Endowment Committee; past member of the Easton Rotary Club; member of the United Fund; on the Board of the Patricia Hopkins Scholarship Fund and a member of the Advisory Council of the Talbot Hospice.

Mr. Romain is survived by his wife, the former Gail Strong whom he married August 8, 1970; three brothers, Douglas Romain of Plymouth, MI, Garrett Romain of Dublin, CA and Lauren Romain of San Diego, CA. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by a brother, Phillip Romain.
