Gerald R. Taylor (Rodney) passed away Thursday, July 21, 2011, at Memorial Hospital in Easton.

Mr. Taylor was born in Baltimore on August 19, 1941. He was the son of the late, George W. and Virginia M. Taylor. They moved to Easton when Rodney was a young child where he lived his entire life. He graduated from Easton High School, Class of 1959. After graduation he served three years in the United States Army and following his honorable discharge, moved back to Easton. He was employed with Maryland National Bank as a teller. He remained with Maryland National Bank for 19 years leaving as Vice President of the Upper Eastern Shore Region.
