February 18, 1927 - January 6, 2015

Harold James Ruff of St. Michaels, MD, passed away peacefully in his sleep on Tuesday, January 6, 2015. He was 87. He was born in Lehigh, PA, on February 18, 1927, to the late Robert and Eva Ruff.

He served as a Naval Corpsman at Bethesda Naval Hospital during World War II and also served as a Marine Corp Reservist. He was married to Dorothy Sine. They had five children; Thomas, Dennis, Jeffrey, Susan, and Kenneth, who died in infancy. In 1972, he married Virginia B. Schumacher, who had three children; Linda, Carol, and Debra.

Mr. Ruff was known for his construction expertise, and especially for hotels he built and managed on the Eastern Shore of Maryland. Prior to coming to St. Michaels, he was a long-time member of the Rockville Presbyterian Church, and had a thriving construction business in Montgomery County, MD.

In addition to his wife, Virginia, he is survived by his four children, seven grandchildren, Jeremy, Shelby, Laura, Kathryn, Emily, Steven, and Samantha; one great-grandson, James; and a brother, Willard.

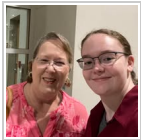
