



Harvey J. Howeth, Sr.

August 15, 1927 - August 2, 2008

Harvey James Howeth, Sr. slipped away peacefully to Heaven on Saturday, August 2, 2008 at his home surrounded by his loving family after a 26 month battle with lung cancer. He would have been 81 on August 15th.

Born August 15, 1927 on Bolton Farm at Wittman, he was the son of the late James Milligan and Katie Olivia Marshall Howeth. Growing up, he lived in the Bay Hundred area. He left school in 1945 to serve his country in the U.S. Navy. After receiving an honorable discharge in 1949, he returned to St. Michaels High School and in 1950 became the school's first 12th grade graduate. On June 20, 1953 he married Eleanor Marie Maxwell. He worked for the U.S. Postal Service, retiring after 30 years. After a brief retirement, he worked for Watkins Auto Supply, Black and Decker, and Advance Auto Parts, retiring in 2004.

He was a member of the Easton Church of The Nazarene and American Legion Post #70.

Mr. Howeth is survived by his devoted and loving wife of 55 years, Eleanor; four children, Sue L. Knight of Easton, Harvey J. "Jim" Howeth, Jr. and his wife Donna of Federalsburg, Michael D.
