February 10, 1922 - June 1, 2014

Hazel Elizabeth Milash of Chestertown, MD, died on Sunday, June 1, 2014, at Chester River Manor. She was 92.

Born on February 10, 1922, in Charleston, SC, she was the daughter of the late Holt and Anna Smith Johns. She moved to Baltimore, MD as a teenager and graduated from Southern High School in 1940. She was part of the greatest generation and met her future husband during World War II, while he was home on leave from the Navy.
