Helen M. Weisman of Easton formerly Claiborne died at the Talbot Hospice House on Wednesday, April 25, 2007. She was 85.

Born in Baltimore on August 6, 1921, she was the daughter of the late William and Augusta Willie Schmitt. Mrs. Weisman attended the Institute of Notre Dame Baltimore and the Maryland Institute of Art. She was a designer and creator of women's fashions especially wedding and cotillion dresses. In recent years, she owned and operated the Ginger Bread House in St. Michaels until moving to Easton. She was a fantastic cook noted for her famous bread recipe. Her husband Raymond F. Weisman, whom she married on October 18, 1941 in Baltimore, died in January 2000.

She was a member of St. Peter and Paul Parish where she attended St. Michaels Chapel. A member of St. Anne's Joachim Society, she was also a member of the Easton Historical Society, a volunteer Thorpe House and a volunteer for Christmas in St. Michaels.

Mrs. Weisman is survived by four children Barbara Ann Dochter of Bel Air, MD; the very Reverend Raymond F. Weisman of Salisbury, MD, Gary T. Weisman Sarasota, FL, and Brian Weisman of St. Michaels. Ten grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. In addition to her parents and husband she was preceded in death by a sister Dorothy Demmitt.

A memorial mass will be celebrated at a 11:00 AM on Friday, May 18, 2007 at the St. Michaels Mission Church, St. Michaels Chapel with her son the very Rev. Raymond F. Weisman serving as celebrant.

Burial will follow at Olivet Cemetery, St. Michaels
