



Henry M. Doebler

August 1, 1934 - August 5, 2014

Henry M. Doebler, previously of Brightwaters, NY, died on Tuesday, August 5, 2014, at Talbot Hospice House in Easton. He was 80.

Mr. Doebler was born on August 1, 1934 at Sea Cliff, New York. He was the son of the late Errol W. Doebler and Mildred Maidment Doebler.

Henry was a graduate of The Choate School, Cornell University, BS, and Brooklyn Law School, JD. He also served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War.

Mr. Doebler married the former Joyce Forsman on October 29, 1960.

Henry was a registered lobbyist for Con Edison in Albany, NY, and Washington, DC. He served as Chairman of the Energy and Telecommunications Committee of the Business Council of New York State, Inc. and as a member of its Legislative Executive Committee. He also served as the Senior Utility Representative at the Energy Association of New York State and on various committees of the Edison Electric Institute in Washington, DC. Mr. Doebler also engaged in pro bono activities for various charitable and not-for-profit causes. He retired from Consolidated Edison, NY, NY.

Henry was affiliated with the Maryland Hall of the Creative Arts, Mid-Shore SCORE, The Easton Club, Chesapeake Maritime Museum, The Historical Society of Talbot County, USNA Distinguished Artists, USNA Women's Track and Field Official and the USNA Athletic Association Blue and Gold.

Mr. Doebler is survived by his wife, Joyce; his children Joanne Garabedian (Edward), Errol Doebler (Jennifer) and Darrell Quiroz; his grandchildren, Jack Garabedian, Noah Garabedian, Henry Doebler, Camille Doebler; and several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by a daughter, Carrie, and a son-in-law, Anthony Gallagher.
