Henry Bradley Fout III (Brad), of St. Michaels, MD died at Talbot Hospice House on June 23, 2024.

Brad was born in Baltimore, MD on February 2, 1949, the son of Henry Bradley Fout and Jane Elizabeth Grimm. Brad attended Dulaney High School in Timonium MD, and subsequently earned a Bachelor's of Science degree from Loyola College and a Master's of Science degree from Kansas State. He became a software engineer and had a successful career with AT&T and then Lucent Technologies. He married Pam on November 28, 1992.

Once Brad retired, he and Pam moved to St. Michaels, MD where he began a new career as owner and operator of Calico Gallery and Calico Toys and Games. Brad learned the art of custom framing which he loved to do, and during the next 20 years met many people along the way who now have artwork beautifully framed by him. He was highly involved in the Business Association and was one of the creators of the Midnight Madness event which continues to enhance the holiday season in St. Michaels today. Brad was a huge fan of both the Baltimore Orioles and the Baltimore Ravens, and always looked forward to attending the games with his children.
