Herbert Swann Wilkinson of Chestertown, Maryland away, January 20, 2026. He was 86.

Herbet was born in Washington, DC on February 10, 1939, to the late Herbert Arnold Wilkinson and Katherine (Stimson) Wilkinson. Herbert graduated from Montgomery Blair High School in 1957, then attended George Washington University and graduated in 1961 then continuing his education obtaining his master's degree in 1963, for Electrical engineering.

Herbert worked with Atlantic Research, then DECO Electronics, Westinghouse, Telcom and finally TASC (The Analytic Science Corp.) where he retired after 20 years. Herbet moved to Chestertown in 1999. Here he engaged in various clubs and was a member of the Omicron Delta Kappa member, Chestertown Lions Club and Christ United Methodist Church.

Herbert worked on the Christmas Basket Project and the Sultana Project as well as becoming a founding member for the Lions of Bluegrass.

Herbert is predeceased by his wife Kara Alkire Wilkinson, whom he married on January 14, 1989. In addition to his wife he was predeceased by his brother Frank Wilkinson and his wife Kathi.

He is survived by his daughter Kathryn Beth Cowan (Paul); sons Thomas Eugene Kernan, Herbet Stuart Wilkinson, Thomas Montrose Wilkinson (Stacy), and Douglas Trevor Wilkinson (Eileen) and 13 grandchildren.
