Herbert Thomas Jump, of Royal Oak, died at William Hill Health Care Center on August 8, 2005. He was 89.

Born in Royal Oak, January 15, 1916, he was the son of the late George I. and Bessie M. Colbourne Jump. After attending St. Michaels high School, he moved to New Jersey where he worked briefly for a grocery store before being employed by the Western Electric Co. where he remained for 39 years, retiring in 1978. During World War II, he served in the U.S. Coast Guard.

A resident of Royal Oak since 1978 when he moved there from Washington, D.C., he was a member of the Royal Oak Community Church, the Edge Creek Boat Club, the Talbot County Izaak Walton League, the Easton Elks Lodge # 1622, the Telephone Pioneers of America, and the AARP. He was an active member of the Easton Lions Club who bestowed upon him the Melvin Jones Fellow Award. In 1990 he was recognized for his many volunteer activities as the Talbot County recipient of the Maryland's Most Beautiful People Award.

Mr. Jump is survived by his son, Donald H. Jump of Gambrills; a daughter, Diane E. Minear of Attleboro, MA; a sister, Ruth Covey of Royal Oak, and a granddaughter, Jennifer Minear of Richmond, VA. His wife of 21 years, Marie Lewis Jump, is deceased. Four sisters, Elsie E. Stevens, Alice E. Billingsley, Bertha Dennis, and Sarah Kirby and four brothers, Weldon Jump, George I

Jump, Jr., Ira C. Jump, and Carl O. Jump are deceased.

Funeral services will be held on Friday, August 12, 2005 at 11 a.m. at the Royal Oak Community United Methodist Church.

Burial will be at Spring Hill Cemetery, Easton.
