



## Holton T. Fluharty

February 28, 1920 - May 6, 2010

Holton Temple Fluharty passed away at home during the early morning hours of May 6, 2010. He was 90.

Born February 28, 1920, he was the last surviving child of the late, George William, Sr. and Florence Alydia (Trax) Fluharty.

Holton dropped out of school after tenth grade to help his father with farming, but soon discovered an aptitude for repairing cars. Thus began his career as an automobile mechanic which included attendance at several General Motors technical schools and spanned almost forty years. He retired from Hallowell Chevrolet of Easton in 1982.

On September 6, 1945, Holton married Erma Mae McCarty in Christ Church, Easton. She passed away February 14, 2005.

Holton is survived by one son, Lee, and several generations of nieces and nephews.

Holton loved the outdoors. In his younger years, rabbit hunting and vegetable gardening were his chief passions. During his senior years, he was active with Curtis Andrew Auctions and continued gardening. Indeed, he had started this season's garden at the time of his death.

In addition to his wife, he was preceded in death by three sisters, Betty Jean Fluharty, Laura Frances Carmine, and Lillian Eurith Harper; three brothers, John Trax, George W., Jr. (Bill), and Ralph Bartlett (Nick); two half-brothers, Harry Raymond and little William; and one half-sister, Helen Embert.

Services will be held at 2:00 pm Thursday, May 13 at the Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Easton, where friends may call one hour prior.

Burial will be at Woodlawn Memorial Park, north of Easton.
