Howard Jackie McLain, known to all as Jack, passed away on February 9, 2026, in Easton, Maryland, at the age of 85.

He was born at home in Holcomb, Missouri, on August 11, 1940, to Erskin and Ruby McLain.

He earned a bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Missouri Rolla in 1964. Before beginning his professional career, Jack served his country with honor as a First Lieutenant in the United States Army during the Vietnam War.

Jack began his career in St. Peters, Missouri, at Monsanto. His career later took him to New Jersey, where he served as Senior Vice President of Operations for Reckitt & Coleman. He concluded his career as President of Chun King.

Beyond his professional accomplishments, Jack was an avid golfer and greatly enjoyed his early retirement years, especially the time spent competing on the golf course with his wife. He took great pride in his home and property and could often be found on his favorite "tractor," keeping watch

over the local wildlife, including the osprey nest he built, spring fawns, and neighboring foxes. He never missed an opportunity to visit the hardware store, happily adding another tool to his ever-growing collection.

Jack is survived by his wife of 56 years, Bernadette Jackson McLain; his daughter, Julie McLain; and his brothers, John McLain; Joe (Retta) McLain; and Jeff (Rebecca) McLain. He also leaves behind many nieces and nephews who will cherish his memory. He was preceded in death by his brother, Jimmie (Margaret) McLain; his brother-in-law, Robert (Margaret) Jackson; and Cody, his beloved Labrador retriever.

Jack will be remembered for his steady, quiet presence, his ability to fix almost anything, and his steadfast belief that anything could be accomplished with the right tool.
