James Robert Finnimore, Jr., “Jimmy,” passed away at Compass Hospice in Centreville, MD, on January 8, 2023. He was 66 years old.

Jimmy was born in Philadelphia, PA, on August 27, 1956, to parents James Joseph and Rita Marie (Condon) Finnimore. He grew up in Philadelphia and worked at the Lafayette Building doing maintenance. 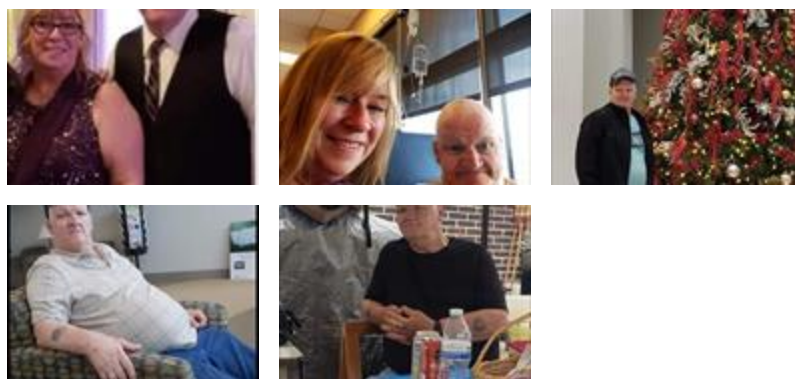
