James “Jim” Douglas Goddard of Stevensville, MD, passed on November 29, 2018, at Anne Arundel Medical Center. He was 68.

Born on May 9, 1950, in Baltimore, MD, he was the son of the late James Rudolph and Lillian Francik Goddard. Jim graduated from Towson State University in 1972 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. He then went to work for Safeway as a clerk and was a member of Local #27 UFCW (United Food and Commercial Workers) and was shop steward at the Kent Island Safeway for many years. Jim retired in 2010.

He was an avid skier in his 20s and 30s and took many trips with the Baltimore Ski Club. His favorite trip was to Banff in Alberta, Canada. He enjoyed fishing and crabbing and was a member of the Kent Island Fishermens Club.
