



James "Jim" Brian Herron

March 28, 1964 - July 12, 2018

James B. Herron of Still Pond, MD, died on Thursday, July 12, 2018, at Medstar Georgetown University Hospital. He was 54.

He was born in West Chester, PA, on March 28, 1964, the son of the late Chester Eugene Herron, Sr. and Betty Jane Mousley Herron who predeceased him in December of 2017.

Jim graduated from East High in West Chester, Dickinson College in Carlisle, PA, with a B.S. Degree in Mathematics. In 1986, he went to Villanova University in Villanova, PA, for a Masters of Science in Mathematics in 1991.

Jim worked as a Painter Contractor for 31 years. He owned and operated Uncle Jim's Painting and Paperhanging Co. out of Still Pond. Jim enjoyed tutoring students in math. He also taught Mathematics in Kent School, Wye River Upper School, and Radcliffe Creek School on the Eastern Shore of Maryland and Gordon Middle School and Villanova University in Pennsylvania.

Jim was first and foremost a family man, he also enjoyed camping, baseball, history, reading, baking bread, sustainable gardening, raising chickens, and playing his guitar.

He is survived by his wife Mary Ann Herron; daughters, Annie and Sarah Herron; sister, Lee Herron Syben; and brother, Chester Eugene Herron, Jr.

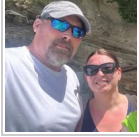
