James Kent Bussey of Millington died Friday, August 19, 2005, in his home. He was 64.

Mr. Bussey was born June 11, 1941, in Baltimore, he was the son of the late, George Joseph and Margaret Snyder Bussey.

He was educated in Baltimore and graduated from the University of Illinois. Mr. Bussey served in the U.S. Air Force in the 22 nd Combat Support Group and was honorable discharged after serving his country for 20 years. He is survived by a daughter, Diana Jane Barlow of Millington; a son, Dana James Bussey of California; two brothers, Earl Bussey of Millington and Francis Bussey of Glen Burnie; three sisters, Nancy Bower of Millington and Marlene Booth and Minnie McElwee, both of Glen Burnie; and seven grandchildren.

Funeral services will be 6 p.m. Monday in Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, 370 West Cypress Street, Millington, where friends may call two hours earlier.

Burial with military honors will be 10 a.m. Tuesday in the Maryland Veterans Cemetery, near Hurlock.
