James Lawrence Slipper. Jr. of Stevensville, Maryland son of the late, James, Sr. and Melba Mae Qwens Slipper was born September 19, 1930 in Baltimore City, Maryland. Surrounded by his family, Jim died at home early Sunday, July 17, 2011 after a short bout with pancreatic cancer.

He is survived by Iris McManus Slipper his loving wife of 57 years; his sons, Michael E. and William Cary, and his special grandson, Ryan Khari Slipper; also by his daughters, Deborah E. Slipper and Donna Marie Moran and her two daughters, AnnMarie and Jessica L. Pagori.

Jim attended Baltimore City Schools, Patterson Park High and Maryland Institute. Joining the Air Force in January 1951 he served in both the Korean and Viet Nam conflicts. After 22 years of service, he retired to Camden S.C. April 1973 and returned to his first love, building, in which he was still active at the time of his death.

Stationed in Germany, Jim organized and served as a Boy Scout Leader. While living in Crisfield, Maryland, he attended Asbury Methodist Church and was a member of the Kiwanis Club. He assisted in the development of the J. Millard Tawes Historical Museum and was a dedicated supporter of its effects. Jim is a man who loved his fellow men.

Funeral services, a private quiet gathering of immediate family and a few close friends, will be held at the gravesite at Kingsley Cemetery, Old Dominion Road, Chester, MD. The Reverend Jeff Pearson of "The Bridge" Church will officiate.
