December 28, 1924 - March 23, 2011

Janet S. Heinbokel died on March 23, 2011. She was 86.

Born in Pasadena, CA, on December 28, 1924, she was the daughter of the late Leo and Harriett Baxter Scott. In 1944, she graduated from Converse College in Spartanburg, SC, with a degree in English. She worked as secretary for the Chief Justice of the South Carolina Supreme Court. She also served on the Planning Commission for the West Lampeter Township.

Mrs. Heinbokel was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Lancaster, PA, where she served as a Deacon for a number of years. Her primary passion was reading. She also enjoyed playing bridge, sewing, needlework, and traveling.

She is survived by her husband, Frederick H. Heinbokel, whom she married on November 24, 1948; her children, John F. Heinbokel and his wife, Lynn, of Barboursville, VA, and Harriett H. Riter and her husband, Charles, of Easton, MD; and a granddaughter, Amanda Gallegos and her husband, Zach. She was preceded in death by her brother, Blynn Scott, and her sister, Sarah Thompson.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00 am on Saturday, April 2, 2011, at the First Presbyterian Church in Lancaster, PA, where the family will receive

friends beginning at 10:00 am.
