Jean Leighton Robinett (Mrs. Blair) died on Saturday, November 17, 2012, at Hospice of Queen Anne's in Centreville, MD. She was 83.

Born Delores Jean Leighton in 1929, she was the daughter of the late, Russell and Laura Leighton. She graduated from Oakland High School in Oakland, MD. She worked as a volunteer nurse and as a sales clerk and pharmacy assistant at Englander's Pharmacy in Oakland, where she met her future husband, Blair J. Robinett.
