



## Jeanne Audrey Maglin Klug

June 26, 1937 - September 28, 2008

Jeanne Audrey Maglin Klug, 71, of Easton died peacefully at her home with her husband and family at her side after a 17 year struggle with Leukemia on Sunday, September 28, 2008.

Jeanne was born in The Bronx, New York City on June 26, 1937 the only child of Louis and Louise Zahn Winbarg. She grew up in Cornwall – on – Hudson, NY living on the Curie Idlewild Estate. She graduated from Cornwall – on – Hudson High School in 1954 and was recognized as “Best All Around Senior.” She married Jere Prescott Maglin in 1957 and moved to Kensington, Maryland where she raised four children. She was a very generous spirit. When she didn’t have the means to donate, she volunteered her time. Later when she had the means, she gave both her time and money to many charities and individuals in need. She was a Girl Scout leader for her three daughters and taught CCD at Holy Redeemer Church in Kensington, MD.

She began her working career for Braniff Airlines as secretary to the President, where she began her life long love for travel. Jeanne then worked for C & P Telephone (Bell Atlantic, now Verizon) for over 25 years. She progressed through a variety of assignments with increased responsibility including the Business Office and the Consumer Marketing organization. She was perhaps best known for her role as a Community Relations Manager, where she was credited with creating a number of initiatives, many of which

still benefit communities throughout the metropolitan Washington area. She was awarded a Certificate in Community Relations from Boston College. She will be missed by colleagues as well as community and business leaders who came to respect, appreciate and value her creativity and integrity. She exemplified the working women breaking through many glass ceilings and taking work place discrimination head on. Working full time, Jeanne raised and provided for her children imbuing them with the old fashion values that she lived every day – integrity, determination, faith and respect.

On August 21, 1983 Jeanne married her husband of 25 years Norman P. Klug. A year later they renewed their vows in the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church. They lived in Bethesda and Rockville, Maryland. Jeanne served in leadership roles in a number of business and nonprofit organizations, where she tested the status quo and challenged others to redefine the parameters of success. She was recognized for her activism in local volunteering by the D.C. Corporate Volunteer Council. Jeanne attended two White House luncheons where she was given the President's Volunteer/Action Award in 1986 and 1987 by President Reagan. She was one of the original "Points of Light" for President George Bush, Sr. where she was again personally recognized by the President for organizing community programs. A Toastmasters since 1974 – her trademark speech was "Dress for Success," Jeanne was a training instructor and conducted workshops nationwide and broke another glass ceiling as the first woman President of Silver Spring club in its 25 year history. Jeanne and her husband, Norman, team taught a public speaking course for Montgomery County Adult Education. She also taught "Effective Speaking" at Chesapeake College. Jeanne retired in 1993.

In retirement she continued her volunteering serving for many years on the Board of Community Ministries of Rockville (CMR), combining her strong faith with her commitment to service. She served as Vice President and was the

representative for St. Raphael's Catholic Church. In 1993, she co-founded CMR's Latino Outreach Program and funded a monetary award to outstanding students. She also was a Eucharistic Minister at St. Raphael's Catholic Church in Rockville, MD.

Diagnosed with Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia in 1991 she educated herself in every aspect of the disease and treatments. Involved in many support groups she was asked to be a patient ambassador for Leukemia, providing peer counseling to other patients. She fought her battle with Leukemia the same way she lived her life, with dignity and strength.

Retiring to Easton, Maryland in 1997, she continued her community service. She was an active reader to classes at St. Michael's Elementary School where she was known as the "Reading Angel." She organized book donations for the school from her former employer, Verizon. An active member of the St. Michael's Mission Parish as a Eucharistic Minister, and helping maintain the altar linens and vestments. Most recently as President of Thread Haven Questers, she contributed in the winning of the first Questers' grant to aid the restoration of Chaney House at St. Michael's Museum.

She always put family first and her love for all was unconditional. The every growing family was bound together with her love and the many family celebrations throughout the year. Jeanne is survived by her loving husband, Norman; her children Beverly Maglin of Annapolis, Maryland, Margo Boone of Gaithersburg, Maryland, Elise and her husband Doug Brammer of Fairfax, Virginia, Dr. Robert and his wife Kate Klug of Salisbury, Maryland and Mark and his wife Melissa Maglin of Corpus Christi, TX; ten grandchildren, Erik Boone, Amanda Boone, Morgan Boone, Jordan Brammer, Justin Brammer, Caroline Klug, Christopher Klug; Scott Klug; Matthew Maglin, Madison Maglin; and two great grand children, Aiden Boone and Mackenzie Boone. She

celebrates eternal life with children Sandra and Michael and grandson Chase.

There will be a visitation at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Easton on Friday, October 3rd from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. with a Recitation of the Rosary at 7:45 p.m. A funeral mass will be held at St. Micheal's Mission Catholic Church at 10:00 a.m. Saturday, October 4th. A private graveside service for family will be held at a later date at Gates of Heaven Cemetery, Silver Spring, Maryland.
