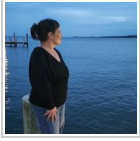

Anyway, I wish Poppy was there too, I miss him so very much. I'll never forget this evening or the love I felt, the complete peace and smiles on your faces in my dream.

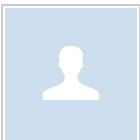

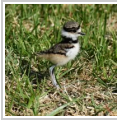
