Jerry Lynn Miller, of Annapolis, MD, died in his home on Thursday, April 9, 2009. He was 62 years old. Jerry lost a hard-fought battle with melanoma. Jerry was raised in Fresno, California, and traveled the country and the world in the service of the United States Government. Jerry enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1966 and eventually retired from the Air Force Reserves as a Senior Master Sergeant. Jerry joined the U.S. Border Patrol upon college graduation, served in Southern California, and then joined the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms in 1976. He worked as a Special Agent in California, the Resident Agent in Charge in Salt Lake City, Utah, Program Manager at Headquarters in Washington DC, as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge in St Louis, MO and Baltimore, MD, and as the BATF liaison with Interpol, in Lyon, France. He retired from BATF in 2003. He spent his retirement years travelling, painting watercolors, working part time training Foreign Service personnel, and driving his beloved sports car.

Jerry is survived by his wife, Pamela; his sons Scott of Bellevue, NE, Chris and Andrew of St Louis, MO, his grandson Justin of St Louis, MO; his parents Bert and Katherine Miller of Stevensville, MT and numerous friends and family members.
