January 13, 1929 - July 25, 2014

Jess Gordon Judy, 85, of Ridgely, MD, died peacefully at the Queen Anne's County Hospice Center on Friday, July 25, 2014, following a long illness.

Born in Everett, PA, on January 13, 1929, he was the third son of the late David Preston and Orpha G. (Furlow) Judy. Jess spent his early years helping to support his siblings following the death of his father. He entered the Marine Corps September 4, 1951, at the age of twenty-two. He was wounded in action and awarded the Purple Heart. Upon returning home, he met and married Fay Dian Gist, and they were blessed with four children. Jess supported his wife and children by working in construction and other trades.

He is survived by his children, Dian F. Poore, Ronald G. (Judy) Sharman, John R. (Judy) Sharman; first wife, Fay Dian (Judy) Sharman; grandchildren, John E. Moriarty, Kathleen M. (Moriarty) Hinds, Kimberly C. Moriarty, Shannon M. Poore, Carmen A. Judy; a brother, Allen E. Judy; and sisters, Shirley Connolly, Martha Foley and Noma Canfield. He was preceded in death by his son, Daniel C. Judy; grandson, Benjamin L. Judy; and brother, Wayne D. Judy, who passed away July 22, 2014.

Interment will be held at 10 a.m. on Monday, August 4, at the Maryland Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery in Hurlock, MD.
