Joanne Phyllis Miksa nee Trabert of Stevensville, MD, died on January 10, 2014. She was 74.

Born on August 30, 1939, to the late Frank and Ruth Urner Trabert. She graduated Seton High School in 1957 and then married William Joseph Miksa on August 31, 1957. They resided in Baltimore until 1988 when they moved to Stevensville. Her husband predeceased her in 2007.
