



## Joanne P. Wheatley

February 22, 1935 - December 31, 2016

Joanne Pope Wheatley of Oxford, MD, passed away peacefully surrounded by her loved ones after a long and courageous battle with Alzheimer's on Saturday December 31, 2016. She was 81.

Born on February 22, 1935, she was the daughter of the late Harry C. Pope and Lillian F. Forrest. After graduating high school, she married the love of her life Earl M. Wheatley, Jr. They resided in Oxford where she worked as a secretary and homemaker. She had a passion for antiques and owned several antique stores in Oxford and St. Michaels. In her later years, she served as a caregiver to the elderly, also volunteering with hospice care. She enjoyed bird watching and had a love for animals, especially her beloved cat, Lucy. Her favorite thing was spending time with her family and grandchildren. She had a kind and gentle heart and was well-loved by everyone who knew her.

Mrs. Wheatley is survived by her four children, Stephany Allendorf (Stephen) of Preston, Mitchell Wheatley (Darlene) of Easton, Karyn Wheatley of Toddville, and Skip Wheatley (Lisa) of Cockeysville; a sister, Norma Daffin of Tunis Mills; ten grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.
